Dear Mr. Buntain,

Thank-you for your letter and the reports. Your Centre will be well represented in the Comet and Nova Section display at the General Assembly of the R.A.S.C. being held in Edmonton on May 18-20.

Comet Seki-Lines looks like a fine comet. My first observation was made on April 7. The brightness seems to be close to that predicted, but I found that it's light is spread over such a large area that it is a better object in binoculars than in a telescope. At first, I looked for Seki-Lines with my 4" reflector, but could not find it. Then I looked up and saw it with my naked eye! It was much better through my binoculars, showing a tail of over 6° . I then located it with my telescope as a faint "smudge" with little detail.

To date, only the Hamilton and Montreal Centres have send reports although I have received interesting material from Niagara Falls, and indications of interest from about half of the 16 Centres.
