Dear Dr. Morris,

I understand that the Montreal Centre members made a number of observations of Comets Seki-Lines and Humason. Being National Coordinator for the Comet and Nova Section of the RASC, I would be interested in knowing just what work was done in the Comet Section of the Montreal Centre. Although I am a member of the Montreal Centre myself, I have been "out of town" for some time, and was unable to keep up on the latest news on the Comet Section.

Since I ~~was~~ now in northern Canada, and since the summer and autumn weather is poor, I was unable to observe Comet Humason myself. (Humason moved to a low declination rapidly).

From reports received from other Centres, it would seem that Humason was at greatest brilliancy somewhat earlier than predicted, and was fainter than predicted. Do the Montreal Observations indicate this?
