Dear Sir,-

Your card re Comet Ikeya 1963b arrived yesterday morning amid showers. Just after midnight it cleared enough for me to try a couple of search areas. There was quite a bit of cloud blowing around but I managed to check two areas. The gibbous moon did not make matters any better!

There was no sign of the new comet in the 7x50's, or in my  $4\frac{1}{4}$ " f11.3 Reflector which I later dug out of the basement. Finally I brought out just the tube to the 8" reflector, and leaning it against a chair I managed to glimpse the comet & pin point it so that I could see it in the  $4\frac{1}{4}$ ". I still could not see it in the binoculars although stars of  $7\frac{1}{2}$  magnitude were faintly visible. In the 8", no tail was visible & no pronounced stellar nucleus. This first sighting was at 0115 E.S.T. APRIL 4, 1963. Later I tried a couple of exposures, which I developed tonight. They are poor ones, & I was not able to find the comet on them whilst they were wet. Thank you very much for the information - this comet is in a good high position, although the bright moon will make observations difficult.

I haven't yet finished all the searches for March - a couple of dozen, I think. They will be sent in a few days.

None of the pictures of comet Ikeya were suitable for making up a display (I'm referring to my own efforts). It did not get high enough above the horizon.

Hope to be having some better weather soon!
