Thank-you for your letter of June 24 re: Mr. Whitman. I have received two letters from him to date and have answered him. On June 8, I sent him instuctions regarding the Comet & Nova Section, including C & N Form #1 which suggests how area charts may be made. I think that "Norton's" Star Atlas is one of the best to use in preparing area charts, as the observer will find that this will give him a moderate number of stars to start with and he can add fainter ones later, as he observes them.

By the way, one of our unattached members in the U.S.A. made an independent discovery of what may be a new comet. He is A. J. Morehouse, and reported the following:

June 22/23 03:05EST R.A. 23h 34m Dec. 22° 10'N June 23/24 03:00EST R.A. 23h 33m Dec. 22° 00'N Mag. 10-11 Mr. Morehouse used a Skalnato-Pleso Atlas Coeli. These positions seem to agree with the reported discovery listed on the Harvard Announcement Card #1604 dated June 21. I also note that doubt was raised as to the existence of the comet on H.A.C. 1606 dated June 24.
