Eclipse night (Dec 30) was a good night, but was very cold (down to -15°F), and I observed the eclipse from "moon enters penumbra" to "total eclipse ends". The eclipse was very dark, and the only observers who could see it during totality was a group far from the city. I pin-pointed the location of the moon on my star atlas from an ephemeris, and pointed my 8" telescope at that region of the sky, but I still could not locate the moon!
